Essay Questions (approximately 300-500 words)

The American Studies major gives students freedom to select courses from across the University that address a central intellectual topic or theme that is comparativist between American ethnic/racial/social communities OR transnational in focus. Most students change their theme during their years in the program as their interests and knowledge grow, but they enter with an intellectual interest they wish to pursue. What possible topic(s) or theme(s) currently most interest you? Why? Please point out the basis of this interest, i.e., how and where it began and what you have done to date to pursue it.
- B. The American Studies Program asks its students to reflect on what they read, see, and experience. Is there something that you have read, seen, or experienced (e.g., a book or article, a play or film, a trip or other event) <u>since you arrived in college</u> that in some important way or ways has influenced how you think or your understanding of America's place in the world? Please identify this something and explain why and how it has influenced you or why you found it interesting.
